- Teacher Representative Update, Karen Emmons:
 - There is always so much happening in 4th grade! Students are writing and typing their CA research reports, studying Author's Craft how authors make their stories come alive! and reading biographies of influential African Americans! Here are some pics from Miss Pollack's class of an African American history quilt the students are creating.
- Board of Trustees Update, Katherine Chan:
 - COVID-19 Update:
 - -Vaccinations: We are on track to offer all staff both doses of Pfizer or Moderna vaccines by March 26, making it possible for us to return to full class sizes by April 12. Staff now eligible to make appointments through the county vaccination sites, Costco, and Public Health is partnering with MCOE to offer "Super Pod" vaccination events on March 6 and 13, with second doses scheduled for March 27 and April 3.
 - -We are in discussion with LCMEA on conditions of going back to school, and details still need to be worked out. Proposing an 8 am - 2

- pm-ish schedule, but our default is the traditional 8-3 pm, with early release on Wednesdays.
- Good news: Latest CDC guidance and NYT analysis of case rates show that Marin County is one of few counties in the country (4%) that meet the CDC's recommendation for full reopening of K-12 schools.

2021-22 Budget Scenarios:

- Held Board Budget Session and parent budget meetings to review our financial outlook. We are trying to stay conservative with any cuts to the budget at this time since there are still so many unknowns.
 - Good news: we are eligible to receive funding from Gov.
 Newsom's \$2 billion incentivizing schools to re-open, since we've been open all along. But this is one-time funding only, and when we look at multi-year projections, we know we need to make cuts in order to keep our reserves healthy. With this in mind, we've modeled the follow the cuts for next year:
 - \$40,000 reduction in professional development budget
 - Offering Independent Study for Elite Athletes
 - Reducing 6th grade PE days at Hall and collapsing the
 Hall day into 6 periods instead of 7
 - Reducing second elective for 7th-8th grade at Hall by offering it as a choice
 - Increasing certain core Hall Class sizes, depending on subject matter
 - Hall administration is reviewing these scenarios to see if they can make it work, and will review options at next board meeting

Refinancing School Bonds:

- Voted to refinance our bonds, saving Larkspur and Corte Madera taxpayers approximately \$7.1 million.
