  - The show will be more streamlined this year

- Principal Update Kyle Shaw

- New PBIS system launched this week at both elementary schools
  - This week our focus is on SOAR and we will share that with parents at the end of the week.
  - Honed in on 6 places around campus where we really are focusing on these clear expectations: playground, bathroom, hallways, before and after school, assembly
  - Signage will go up around campus
  - This is a pilot mode and we will continue to work with students and teachers to adjust as needed
  - This is a really big focus for the staff
  - Question: Is this our approach to set our expectations and clearly state our expectations so everyone understands expected behavior?
    - Yes, we needed to take some intentional time to really teach these expectations to all students
  - This is really about trying to figure out how to shift and change our approach since Covid rather than just keep doing what we were doing prior to the pandemic
  - We need to have a collaborative approach. This means there will be staff accountability, parent accountability, and student accountability.
- Transition to Hall Middle School Toni Brown
  - I spend a lot of time at Hall and realize that I would like to get to know parents more at the elementary schools and I want to help make the transition to middle school successful
  - I want to make sure you all understand that there is an open door policy and I always am open to talking to all of you
  - We understand that the transition to middle school is a precursor for the transition to high school
  - There are tours of Hall Middle Schools that you can sign up for through the Sunday weekly emails
  - There will be a series of events to help 5th graders transition:
    - Principal will meet with 5th graders and start to talk about middle school beginning in January
    - Then the Hall leadership classes will visit the elementary schools to answer questions
    - Parent Night in May for incoming middle school families
    - 5th graders will walk over to visit the school during the day and the leadership committee works really hard to explain everything to the students which help ease their anxiety about the transition
    - Dr. Brown will then send out emails about scheduling, etc
    - Tuesday before school starts is a Cougar Prep Day and an orientation day for incoming 6th graders and new students

- Tamalpais Unified High School District Bond Measure Annie Sherman
  - Measure A will be on our March 5 ballot
  - Very important measure and important that people actually vote!
  - Please sign up for a lawn sign and show your support for Measure A
  - Annie is happy to answer any questions
  - This is a facilities bond. In California, the state doesn't provide funds for facilities maintenance/capital costs (parcel tax cannot be used for these expenditures). This includes repairs, etc
  - \$517 million and will help on all five campuses
  - There are over 47,000 houses in the school district
  - There is a facilities master plan on the website that outlines the projects and provides a lot of helpful information.

- PTO Board Updates and Discussion Items:
  - o Campus Conservation & Hawk's Garden Natasha Chalmers
    - The garden is in full winter mode and Dana Swisher has been maintaining the garden over these cold months.
    - We will do our spring prep for the garden on Sunday, February 4th, so bring your kids for coffee/donuts - will plan for what we will plant for spring.
    - Jen Moss's family donated two large galvanized planters and the soil to fill them to the Hawks garden.
    - **Growing Up Green fundraiser at Sloat**. The garden gets 10% back on all purchases. Runs Jan 5-14.
  - Safety Taskforce Natasha Chalmers
    - Last Safety Meeting took place on 12/13.
    - Definitions: The task force talked about staff/student perceptions of safety at school and emphasized the importance

of having a shared understanding of certain terms around school safety. These included:

- Psychological Safety: place where one can be candid where someone is comfortable taking an interpersonal
  risk eg speaking up to ask a question and possibly even
  making a mistake (without repercussion)
- Social & Emotional Safety: Defined as an environment where individuals feel safe to express emotions, are free from harassment and bullying, and feel their voice is valued and respected. The goal is for students and staff to feel a sense of belonging and safety.
- Identity Safety: Focused on creating an environment where all school stakeholders feel their social identity is an asset rather than a barrier to success - actively countering negative stereotypes.
- Bullying: Defined per Education Code 48900(r), encompassing severe or pervasive physical or verbal abuse, including electronic communications

## Current Initiatives:

- Continuous efforts to ensure schools are safe spaces for teachers, students, and staff.
- Continuation of Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) support across all schools, including PBIS as discussed earlier by Kyle.
- Staff training on Antisemitism conducted by the Institute for Curriculum Services, with plans to extend training to parents.
- Counseling and Support
- School Safety Survey administered by Hanover (one of our school safety consultants). You may recall seeing a survey right after Thanksgiving. Results are in and being organized and these will be reviewed in the next meeting at the end of January.
- Keenan physical consultants also conducted site visits and expect final results next week.
